Thank you for your interest in Auburn University's Child Life Practicum Program at East Alabama Health. Individuals involved in the practicum program will gain experience working with children through the Emergency Department, General Pediatrics Unit, Radiology, and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Opportunities to work with other units such as surgery, CVICU, ICU, and bi-monthly sickle cell clinic are also available on occasion. Additional experiences to see behind the scenes of Child Life from a non-profit perspective at Smile-A-Mile, in Birmingham, AL are possible. Patients range from birth to eighteen-years-old. At this time, we are able to offer practicum during the fall, spring, and summer semester. This packet includes a description of our practicum program and application requirement materials.

Our Child Life practicum offers opportunities for students including:

- Interacting daily with children/families in the healthcare setting, as well as our interdisciplinary team of medical professionals
- Recognizing and understanding child/family reactions to stress, illness, and pain.
- Identifying the importance of medical preparation and procedural support to promote positive coping outcomes.
- Observing medical procedures when appropriate.
- Recognizing the value of education, play, and psychosocially supportive interventions.
- Learning to plan and facilitate a variety of activities for children of diverse ages and capabilities.
- Expanding knowledge of medical terminology.
- Adapting skills of prioritization, setting goals, self-evaluation, and time management.
- Developing professional attitudes, growth, maturity, and judgement.

A practicum provides the student an opportunity to became familiar with Child Life services and children's reactions to hospitalization. Observational experiences and assignments encourage the development of communication skills with individuals and groups, provide supportive environment to integrate theory with clinical practice and enhance the student's experience with planning and implementing therapeutic activities.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Our Practicum Program is designed for Auburn University Child Life Students only
- Completion of sophomore year of an accredited university within a curriculum that reflects an understanding of growth across the lifespan and families theories
- A minimum of a 3.0 GPA
- Completion or current enrollment in at least one of the following courses:
 - 1. Hospitalized Children and Their Families
 - 2. Therapeutic Play
- Completion of a total of 100 hours of verifiable volunteer fieldwork experience with children in a structured environment (i.e., child development center, daycare, preschool, children's hospital, camp, etc.). Volunteer with hospitalized children is strongly encouraged
- Applicants must be able to commit to a minimum of 120 hours in the hospital over the course of one semester. Students are expected to be available for child life practicum during regular business hours
- Well-developed interpersonal and communication skills
- Adaptability and flexibility

*If accepted into our practicum program, you must provide copies of your current completed 10 panel Drug Screen, background check (see *administrative support in Spidle 203 for College of Human Sciences background check process to request a copy),* current professional liability insurance (form acquired from Auburn University Risk Management & Safety-- Phone (334) 844-4533), all current immunizations: including PPD, TB, Hepatitis B x3, MMR2, current Tetanus Vaccine (within 10 years), current Flu vaccine, a completed-negative PPD Test, a COVID-19 acknowledgement waiver, and a copy of current CPR/BLS Certification [Certification must be provided from the <u>AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION:</u> CPR/Basic Life Support Certification as required by EAH's Education Policy. *Absolutely NO other form of CPR/BLS certification will be accepted.*]
